Professional Experience

Mr. Johnson is a world class trained architect with extensive experience in interdisciplinary large-scale projects involving both renovation and new construction. He has a specialized expertise in the programming, design and construction of corner lot urban structures located at or near densely trafficked, vehicular intersections. Mr. Johnson's portfolio includes 214 Lincoln Street a \$6.5M 4 story office building in Allston MA for Edward C. Madden, Sr. Comprising professional offices and on-grade parking for 200 vehicles, this facility features horizontal two-tone belt coursing and solar blue insulating glass over a structural steel frame. Mr. Johnson was lead design consulting architect responsible for the overall design of the \$40M North Complex Elizabeth Seton Pavilion, a major addition to St. Elizabeth's Hospital of Boston. This medical facility features bold sculpted forms, maritime-styled portal windows, two-tone masonry belt coursing; and a new Chapel building with a chevron-styled entrance, ICU/medical/surgical beds floors and glass-enclosed concrete post-elevated and cantilevered full-service cafeteria overlooking downtown Brighton MA. Mr. Johnson's commercial work includes 1-9 Henshaw Street a crescent-shaped curvilinear one story renovation in Brighton Center across from the Hospital. Mr. Johnson led the Boston Back Bay Neighborhood Association-approved design for BACI'S, a city block commercial renovation consisting of a bottiglia, groceria & outdoor café with copper-clad bowfront and Vermont granite beltcourses.
